PA Supreme Court Extends Mail In Voting Deadline

Nearly 40,000 mail-in ballots were not counted in the June Primary. It would have been more if the Governor had not extended the deadline to include ballots post marked by Election Day in some counties. It would have been less if he had extended the same courtesy to all voters in the state.

According to the PA Department of State, more than 18,000 of the ballots that were cancelled and not counted in the June Primary were omitted from the count because they arrived after the deadline. In addition, almost 7,000 ballots had been marked undeliverable. That's 25,000 vote not counted due to postal issues. We know, from recent events, that postal delivery delays are a real possibility.

On September 17th, the PA Supreme Court decided a case extending the deadline for mail-in votes for all Pennsylvania voters. Your mail-in ballot will be counted as long as it's mailed by November 3rd and arrives by November 7th. (Assuming you followed all of the other rules for mail-in voting) The deadline to request a mail-in ballot in PA is October 27th. If a voter requests one on that day, which is perfectly valid, they may have been hard pressed to receive it and return it by November 3rd. The extension makes sense in light of this tight time frame.

Rep. Keller, in the Lock Have Express on September 19th, was reported as saying that this ruling "undermines election integrity" and "the security of our election system." Quite the opposite. This ruling will ensure that fewer Pennsylvania voters will be disenfranchised. More valid votes will be counted. In my book, that's a good thing. If elected Representative for the 12th District, I would be encouraging people to vote and working to make it easier, not harder, for every eligible citizen to vote.
